young Actors; that this Play had been revived for no other Purpose, that it was
impossible for the old ones to last forever, and therefore he beg'd the Audience to
be silent, and give those who were desirous of it the liberty of hearing.' This
Speech was interrupted by a thundering Clap, and produced a good effect for an
Act, and then the hissing began again, and grew so violent towards the latter end,
that they were obliged to give the Play out two or three times, and much ado
