Rosa Carlini, Giuseppi Forti, and Gallini. The company gave 55 performances of 5 different operas—*Attalo*, *Demetrio*, *Il Ciro Riconosciuto*, *Il Trionfo de Gloria*, and *Farnace*. Cocchi's *Ciro Riconosciuto* was given the most performances, but was followed closely by Perez's *Farnace*.

I record eight sporadic performances at the Haymarket, seven at Bartholemew Fair, four at the Southwark Fair, and one each at Ranelagh, Hampstead, and at the Great Room, Dean Street, Soho. An impressive number of 107 performances of burlettas occurred at Marlebone Gardens. During the summer three pieces alternated there—*La Serva Padrona*, *La Cisisbea*, and *La Strattagemma*. Admission charges began at 2s. 6d., but levelled off at 1s. The performances were customarily out of doors. But one can chart the London weather conditions by the newspaper notices for the plays which twice (May—cold and rainy, and August—wet) necessitated advertising indoor performances in a well-fitted and well-lighted room. Prices upon such rainy occasions were raised to 2s. 6d.
