As a new offering he brought from Edinburgh the first London performance of Home's *Douglas* (14 March).

With Giardini leading the orchestra, seven prominent singers formed the basic company at the King's Opera House, which gave 49 performances: Signora Frasi, Signora Grandis, Signora Mareschi, Signora Regina Mingotti (manager), Signora Passerini, Pazzagli, and Giuseppe Ricciarelli.

Only 31 performances were given at booths, great rooms, chapels, and at the Little Theatre in the Haymarket. Many of these were single night stands by actors drawn together for a benefit, but Theophilus Cibber seems to have had a company and to have engaged the Haymarket in the summer. Eleven actors and actresses, eleven dancers, seven singers, and four specialty performers threaded their way through the non patent theatre performances: Madam Chise, T. Cibber, Miss Derham, Drummond, Miss Filizau, Mrs Frimble, Gillet, Mrs Harman, Miss Jones, Trueman, and Tunbridge. Dancers: Master Cawley, Mlle Dulisse, Froment, Harrison, Master Hussey, Master Jolly, Lasci, Miss Matthews, Master Moore, Settree, and Mrs Vivier; Singers: Baildon, Miss Gaudry, Lauder, Signora Peralta, Sadler, Savage's "celebrated Boy," and Wass. Specialist performers: Signora Caterina (wire), Franklin (tight rope?), Miss Isabella Wilkinson (slack wire), and Joseph Woodbridge (kettle drums).
