[In mainpiece the playbill retains Mrs Bland; in afterpiece the playbill assigns Euphrosyne *and* 1st Bacchant to Mrs Bland, 2nd Bacchant to Miss De Camp, Pastoral Nymph to Miss Dall, but “In consequence of the sudden indisposition of Mrs Bland . . . nearly the whole female cast of *Comus* was last night altered a short time previous to the performance. Miss Dall was the Euphrosyne, Miss De Camp the 1st Bacchant, and Mrs Bramwell the Pastoral Nymph.
