The Hazard Club (from THE CHOICE OF HARLEQUIN) — *Come pass the Box*, composed by [M.] Arne, by Bowden, Townsend, Haymes, Philipps, Linton, Street, Gray, &c. Prison Scene — with a *Hornpipe* in Fetters by Blurton.

*PART II.* An exact Representation of the Telegraphe, in which is shewn the manner of conveying Intelligence, demanding Questions, and receiving Answers. A View of Dover, with the Fleet prepared for Sea—The arrival of an Express from the Admiralty by the Telegraphe—the Sailing of the Fleet, &c., with *Rule Britannia* by Townsend and Chorus. Park Wall, changes to a Public House. The Trick Tea Chest, Harlequin's Leap and Transformation. The Kitchen Scene by Messink. Harlequin changes to a Lobster. A Landscape painted by Lambert, which changes to the Wash-House Scene (from THE SORCERER) invented by Rich. Pantaloon's House and Garden Wall—a Venetian Window changes to a Ladder—with the Clown's Disaster in the Horse Trough. Outside of Pantaloon's House—the art of making Punch—the Transformation of Punch to a Wheel-Barrow invented by Rich. The Statuary Yard invented by Messink—Harlequin Gladiator. A Dark Wood—Harlequin and Columbine, guarded by Virtue, are shewn the Cavern of Vice, in which are personified Intemperance, Deceit, Avarice, Gaming, Drunkenness, Lust, and Murder. To conclude with a Representation of the Temple of Virtue, in which the Vices give place to Prudence, Justice, Temperance, Fortitude, and Charity. And Harlequin and Columbine are united at the Altar of Hymen.
